Next Gen Free Online After School Program



SFCASA encourages Advocates to consider if and how they might feel comfortable resuming in-person visits with their youth. Bay Area Video Coalition's Next Gen after school program offers training in video production, audio production, game code design, and animation for youth ages 14-17. The program is free to all participants and will be offered online this school year. The Fall 2020 program runs from September-December on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Learn to Be Free Tutoring Program

As schools gear up for distance learning this fall, we are continuing to share educational resources to support your youth.

SFCASA has a partnership with *Learn to Be Tutoring*, a nonprofit that provides free and remote tutoring services to K-12 students in math, reading, writing, and English. Due to placement and school changes, youth in foster care often fall behind academically as they may not have access to the extra support and personalized attention they need to thrive. Since Learn to Be offers online services, youth can work with the same tutor regardless of where they live or what school they attend.

Our partnership includes a customized <u>enrollment link</u> where CASAs can automatically sign their youth up for a tutor!
