Support Financial Justice for Foster Youth in CY2023 with the SF Foster Youth Tax Project!

For the second year and in partnership with John Burton Advocates for Youth, SFCASA will serve as Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) site in February 2023- April 2023 and we are looking for community volunteer partners to help us provide this free tax service to foster youth during the upcoming tax filing season.

- Last year tax project volunteers across six California counties (including San Francisco and SFCASA's site) supported current and former foster youth to realize \$628,538 in total refunds with an average credit/rebate of \$2,789 per filer.
- Beginning in CY 2023 California's foster youth are eligible for the first in the nation state tax credit for current and former foster youth in the amount up to \$1,000 for those earning at least \$1 and up to \$29,999.
- And, with only 1% of eligible young adults served in CY2022 we cannot wait to realize greater impact in CY2023!

To become a VITA volunteer (volunteers may volunteer in person or virtually), one must first complete the virtual tax preparer training hosted by the United Way Bay Area and pass one of the following open-book certification tests; Basic, Advanced or Qualified Experienced. The volunteer training will be conducted virtually beginning in January 2023. Register here to learn more about how you can support getting money in the pockets of foster youth!

One Simple Wish is a wish-granting platform that has partnered with SFCASA to grant wishes for the young people we serve. This is a chance for the young person you serve to wish for one big ticket item they've been wanting! 24 SFCASA youth have received laptops, electric scooters, tablets, gaming systems, mattresses, amusement park tickets, and more from One Simple Wish already!

One Simple Wish accepts rolling wishes up to \$500, and has a **Big Wish** program for wishes up to \$5,000.

VOLO Partnership

We are excited about our partnership with **VOLO**. They provide free sports programming to youth in San Francisco that encourages social-emotional learning and character development. Additionally, teaching kids to be active and play sports is a great way to start developing distress tolerance skills. VOLO offers free 6-week sports programs throughout the year. All programs include t-shirts, equipment, staff, and healthy snacks.

SFCASA Peer to Peer Grants

SFCASA's Peer to Peer Grant Program is now open! Grant applications are accepted from the 1st of EVERY month to the 1st of EVERY month up until April 2023! Grant award amounts are between \$500-\$2500 for system-impacted youth throughout the Bay Area to address needs such as education, transportation, housing, and more!

- 1. Young people MUST apply on their own (advocates, PSWs, etc. are welcome to support)
- 2. Two paragraphs MUST be submitted in the young person's application or it will

be denied

3. ALL submitted applications MUST have an invoice to support the amount being requested as youth will NOT be receiving the grant money directly. SFCASA will be paying vendors directly. This means that we will not accept grant applications for smaller requests such as toiletries, clothing, etc. as the funding is a ONE time support and not ongoing.

SFCASA A Home Within Therapy Project

DO YOU KNOW A YOUTH IN FOSTER CARE WE CAN HELP?

A Home Within-CASA Therapy Project (ACTP) matches youth impacted by the foster care system with clinical therapists for weekly pro bono teletherapy sessions.

Clients are in foster care, 12-21 years of age or have recently aged out, many have experienced trauma and would benefit from weekly teletherapy. ACTP offers opportunity to improve communication, address anxiety and depression, and learn self-esteem and self-love so symptoms don't become severe.

Clients can be referred by their CASA volunteer, social worker, other advocate, or they can self-refer. Youth are not required to have a CASA volunteer to participate, and teletherapy doesn't end when the youth ages out of foster care.

ELIGIBILITY

- · Ward of Court or County Dependency Letter required as proof of foster care status
- · iFoster registers youth anonymously on the TMobile network to ensure privacy & can turn phones off as needed (i.e. lost, direct request)
- · Phones arrive assigned to specific youth, activated & ready for use
- · Phones are imaged with the iFoster app to access hundreds of free resources & iFoster's digital life app

Continuing Education trainings are offered to inform your advocacy, help you think creatively about your case, and to build community.

AB12 CE & Support Group

Wednesday, December 7, 2022 6:00-8:00pm on Zoom (2 CE credits) with ILSP Education Advocate Tempest Smith

Is the young person you are supporting turning 18 within the next 2 years? Then this is the right CE for you! Come chat with other CASA volunteers and learn about a young person's transition into AB12! In this CE you will be able to learn about AB12, how your young person can continue to be eligible for AB12 until their 21st birthday, and what some of the common challenges are for young people as they turn 18 and opt into extended foster care.

Holiday Blues: Depression - Working with Teens that are stressed and depressed

Monday, December 12th at 6-8 PM via Zoom (2 CE Credits) with Dr. Natalia Estassi.

Stress can increase their depression, anxiety, and trigger suicidal thoughts. The World Health Organization estimates that approximately 1 million people die each year from suicide. It is the SECOND leading cause of death for ages 10-24 and the THIRD leading cause of death for college-age youth and ages 12-18. Four out of five teens who attempt suicide have given clear warning signs. Learn how to recognize these warning signs and what you can do to save a life. Review the signs and symptoms of depression and anxiety and how they are directly linked to suicide. Study misconceptions about suicide and how to address them in your work. Discuss several tips on preventing suicide, including how to assess the level of suicide risk. Explore common suicide risk factors for children and teens, including problems that may trigger a suicide attempt. Examine alarming statistics to remind you of your crucial role as providers to assess and address suicide with all our youth. Learn how you can make a difference!

Social Skills For Youth: Promoting Pro-Social Behaviors

Youth in foster care suffer higher rates of incarceration, high school dropout, homelessness and unemployment. Also, there is a lot of literature examining disparities in medical health, behavioral health and social and economic wellbeing. Research also suggests that mentoring and social skills training may lead to positive outcomes for various populations of school-aged youth, including

foster youth. Discuss and explore strength based strategies to improve outcomes for the youth we serve.
