

Support Financial Justice with the SF Foster Youth Tax Project

If you are working with a current or former foster youth age 16-25, you can support them to access free tax prep (and get those credits and money into their pockets!) through the Bay Area's inaugural Foster Youth Tax Project in partnership with SFCASA, John Burton Advocates for Youth, First Place for Youth, United Way Bay Area, and San Francisco County Human Services Agency—Family and Children's Services.

While the program is launching with virtual support appointments during the month of February with sites at SFILSP and SFCASA as well as First Place for Youth sites in Alameda and Contra Costa County, partners are hopeful to begin offering in person support beginning in March. Youth can now schedule for support beginning on February 9th and should access <u>this appointment link</u> or the QR code on flyer to get started.

Last year, a similar effort in Santa Clara County served 45 current and former foster youth who were able to get \$135,000 in tax refunds and stimulus payments into the pockets of our foster youth! Volunteers made a big difference in the lives of youth boosting their income by 14% and for young parents by 42%.

Most new advocates first hear about SFCASA from a current or former advocate like you, so we appreciate your helping to spread the word!





Counter Transference and Self Awareness on Monday, February 28, 2022, 6:00 - 8:00 PM on Zoom. (2 CE Credits) with Dr. Natalia Estassi

This training will discuss counter transference, a term Freud founded, and how it can both positively and negatively impact our work as providers. Discussed will be the many environmental and social stressors we are facing today, this includes the COVID-19 pandemic and the racism pandemic, which will impact us in various ways. As a CASA, in hearing the losses and hardships of your youth, one is often triggered, especially in these difficult times. Explore the importance of your own self-awareness to best guarantee one can remain effective as a provider. Learn ways to cultivate self-awareness and the importance of our own boundaries. Review the importance of self-care and barriers that can lead to burnout and vicarious trauma.
