Support Financial Justice for Foster Youth: SF Foster Youth Tax Project!

We are looking for community volunteers to help us provide this free tax service to foster youth during the upcoming tax filing season (February - April 2023).

- Last year tax project volunteers across six California counties (including San Francisco and SFCASA's site) supported current and former foster youth to realize \$628,538 in total refunds with an average credit/rebate of \$2,789 per filer.
- Beginning in 2023 California's foster youth are eligible for the first in the nation state tax credit for current and former foster youth in the amount up to \$1,000 for those earning at least \$1 and up to \$29,999.
- And, with only 1% of eligible young adults served in CY2022 we cannot wait to realize greater impact in CY2023!

To become a VITA volunteer (in person or virtually), one must first complete the virtual tax preparer training hosted by the United Way Bay Area and pass one of the following open-book certification tests; Basic, Advanced or Qualified Experienced. The volunteer training will be conducted virtually beginning in

Stacey has generously transported, visited, arranged for NB's needs to be met, and advocated for NB in an impactful Court Report. Stacey is also planning a grand milestone birthday part for NB soon, working hard to include NB's family.

From periods of no action while NB was away from care, to seasons of tons of activity when NB had many needs, Stacey has remained committed, caring, empathetic, resourceful, patient (!) and collaborative.

SFCASA Peer to Peer Grants

SFCASA's Peer to Peer Grant Program is now open! Grant applications are accepted from the 1st of EVERY month to the 15th of EVERY month up until April 2023! Grant award amounts are between \$500-\$2500 for system-impacted youth throughout the Bay Area to address needs such as education, transportation, housing, and more!

- 1. Young people MUST apply on their own (advocates, PSWs, etc. are welcome to support but can NOT apply on the young person's behalf!)
- 2. Two paragraphs MUST be submitted in the young person's application or it will be denied
- 3. ALL submitted applications MUST have an invoice to support the amount being requested as youth will NOT be receiving the grant money directly. SFCASA will be paying vendors directly. This means that we will not accept grant applications for smaller requests such as toiletries, clothing, etc. as the funding is a ONE time support and not ongoing.
