

They are inviting students to an educational access event on the UC Berkeley campus, focused on preparing graduating high school seniors who will be attending community college

and current community college students in the early stages of their experience. Attendees will hear from current UC Berkeley students who are formerly incarcerated, undocumented or former foster youth and UC Berkeley admissions. SF LGBT Center - Host Homes Program

Host Homes is a program offered to unsheltered LGBTQ young adults (ages 18-24). Participants of this program can choose a home with a San Francisco based community member to reduce the impact of homelessness. As part of this program hosts open their home to provide youth a private space (with access to a kitchen and bathroom) for three months to one year, while youth receive wrap-around supportive services from case managers.

This is a pilot program of the SF LGBT Center in partnership with the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing and Point Source Youth.
